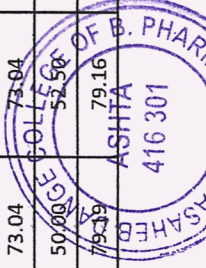
Student satisfaction is one of the most important aspects of organizational performance that is critical for the organization's current and future success.
